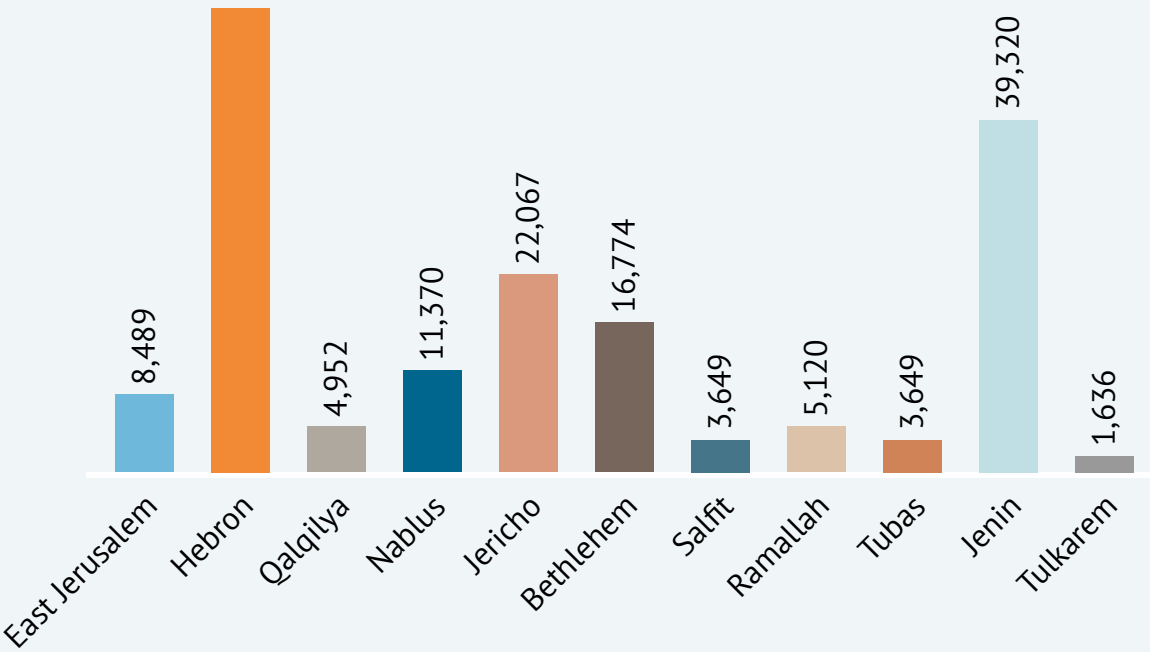
Percentage of people with access to mobile primary health care services



What is a mobile health clinic?

The mobile health clinics serve communities that have no access to primary healthcare services. The mobile health clinics include a doctor, nurse and midwife. They provide primary health care services for a community and also provide curative treatment and some laboratory tests on a daily basis. The clinic is registered and licensed to practice by the MOH. The clinic visits each community at least 4 times per month. There is an established referral mechanism with basic rehabilitation care providers.

168,815 of people have limited or no access to basic primary healthcare services and in need of Mobile Health Services in the West Bank including East Jerusalem



85% of the people with limited access to primary health care services, are located in Area C *

Area C: Over 60 per cent of the West Bank is considered Area C, where Israel retains near exclusive control, including over law enforcement, planning and construction. Most of Area C has been allocated for Israeli settlements or the Israeli military.
