

GENDER MAINSTREAMING CHECKLIST FOR APPEAL PLANNING

Dimension	Gender Elements to Check and Address
Humanitarian Context Analysis	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gender- or age-specific concerns, priorities, and needs are identified and described. • Inequalities or gaps in access to protection, humanitarian services and other opportunities are described.
Prioritization of Needs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identified sectoral gaps and inequalities in access to services/ opportunities are factored into deciding priorities. • Relevant population information is disaggregated by sex and age to enable comparison and differentiation.
Strategic Planning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The strategy describes how equitable benefits and fair distribution of aid benefits to women, girls, boys and men will be assured. • Provides direction on application of the IASC Gender • Proposed actions are logically derived from analysis of the identified priorities/ needs of men and women.
Actions/Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Indicate the target proportions of women, men, boys and girls who will participate.
Coordination and implementation arrangements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Includes how GBV will be addressed within the overall coordination and implementation architecture. • Describes provisions for inclusive and representative structures.
Outputs & Outcomes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Targets, indicators, and results are disaggregated by sex to show respective proportions of men and women who will benefit. • Results (outputs, outcomes) describe <i>how</i> different population groups will benefit.
Costing & Funding	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Funding requirements are broken down by gender marker code • Analysis presents the ratio of assistance (\$\$) directed to men compared to assistance directed to women
