Key issues raised and discussed			
<p>Updates on COVID19 pandemic.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - MoH report that there is a continues increase in number of COVID19 cases in West Bank and recently the increase is very dramatically in Gaza. - A total of 80000 people have vaccinated by the first dose of COVID19 Vaccine in the oPt since the start of the vaccine process. <p>Updates on the 4Ws:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The online sheet is updated by all partners those who are running mobile clinics at current, however there are few duplications in some areas between MoH and PMRS/CRAE. PMRS/CARE confirmed that theses area is without services since the beginning of the year, as well as MoH confirm that they stopped these clinics due to COVID19 outbreak. - PFPPA might have new fund to run medical campaigns (outreach medical services including GP, women health and SRH). Agreed that such outreach activities do not conflict with the minimal service package which agreed upon by the WG partners. - Agreed to continue updates for the 4Ws online sheet. - Agreed to go for bilateral coordination and collaboration between partners to avoid duplications and overlapping of services. <p>HeRAMS:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Agreed that the monitoring system is important to follow up on the implementation, data collection, and analysis thus all are interested to go for the training, however it is important that interested partners should send/confirm to the WG coordinator their interests to participate in HeRAMS training. - Partners are encouraging to keep regular updates to the PRP platform. <p>Capacity building for the mobile clinic staff:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Partners discussed the importance of the capacity building for the mobile clinics staff on different topics such as: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1- GBV 2- Women health and SRH. 3- Disability. 4- MHPSS - These trainings considered as of the most priority which is needed to improve the competencies of the staff, and improve quality of services consequently. - UNFPA is planning to conduct some of these trainings during 2021, UNFPA will coordinate with the WG coordination team to include mobile clinics staff in the training sessions. <p>Holistic and integrated services:</p>			

- The Women Health and Development department (WHDD) in the MoH has highlights on the importance of the coordination between the mobile clinics as part of the PHC and the secondary health care level specially and particular during COVID19 outbreak. The WHDD emphasized on the complementarity role between both care levels and on the importance of the adherence to all guidelines and protocols that were published by the MoH in regard of COVID19 and on how to deal with those with high risk like pregnant and lactating women to reduce the maternal mortality which is relatively increased in 2020 as a result of the pandemic.
- The WHDD stressed on the holistic and integrated service of the mobile clinic to include women health, screening, and SRH services which will mitigate the burden on the beneficiaries and the health system during the emergencies.
